## FROM THE PASTOR

### This Is What I Need

One of the more challenging aspects of being a pastor is discerning what individuals need and expect. There are many different notions among church members about what a pastor should do and be for them. Some people facing illness want to be visited and prayed for by the whole community, some only want the pastor to know, some don't want anyone to know and feel their privacy violated if the word is spread about their problems.

Generational differences vary from those who knew the day when the pastor dropped by the hospital every day to see if any members were there, to today when many members don't even realize that pastors regularly visit those in the hospital and pray with those facing surgery.

Pastoral care also includes many traditional practices such as individual confession and forgiveness, caring conversations about crises and difficult times, healing prayer and anointing, house blessings, and more.

Here's one thing I know: No pastor can rightly guess all the time what each parishioner wants and needs. And occasionally, because what was offered or not offered was not what was wanted, feelings get hurt or wrong assumptions are made. "Why doesn't anyone at the church care?" "Is the pastor doing his/her job?" "Why won't people leave me alone and stop gossiping?"

What do you need? What kind of care from your pastor and church members is helpful to you?

The only way for your church and your pastor to know is for you to say: *This is what I need.*

We may all wish that everyone already knew what we need and we didn't have to ask, but that is not the case. Each of us has to take responsibility for our own emotional, physical, and spiritual life and be willing to say: *This is what I need.*

A mature community of faith keeps the communication lines open about needs and expectations so we can do our best to care for each other.

So, let me begin by letting you know what I need:

1. If you are going to be hospitalized, let me know ahead of time so we can discuss what kind of care you would most appreciate.
2. If you are hospitalized unexpectedly, please have someone call the church office, and let us know if you would like to be visited.
3. When an illness or crisis or joyful event arises, it is helpful if you let the church office know if you would or would not like to be added to the prayer list.
4. If you are facing a difficult time in your family, work, marriage, daily life, emotional health, or spiritual life, know that I am always available to you. Calling to make an appointment to visit with me can be a helpful step in exploring how to address your needs.
5. Let the power and importance of ritual be a part of your life: house blessings, healing prayer, individual confession... these all make the power of the good news of God in Christ present and powerful to us.
6. If you are not attending worship because you are upset about something at church, call me and set a time to meet and talk. Even if we don't agree about something, it is important to be in communication and relationship instead of pulling away.
7. If you love something about the church, share it through a phone call, e-mail, letter, or conversation.

It is a great privilege to serve this community of faith and be called "pastor." Thank you for all the caring ministry we do together for each other and for the world in the name of Christ, our shepherd, our true pastor.

## FROM THE VICAR

### Christ: Our Host and Guest and Home

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

Having entered into Easter joy and departed the solemn wilderness journey of Lent, I recall some words with which I entered this journey myself and with which I invited all of you into a Lenten practice of midweek worship with one another in the homes of members: “We... boldly pray, ‘Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest,’ with the awesome knowledge that our Lord does come into our lives and our homes with transforming power and love.”

I am so grateful for that time of worship, of sharing food and fellowship, of journeying together through scripture as we explored the radical hospitality of God towards us, and the call to live a life of hospitality to others, in turn. It was truly food for my journey and home for my heart.

As we look ahead, I wonder: What has been food for your spiritual journey? What has prodded you beyond sitting still and back onto your feet when you’ve become road-weary? What has made you eager to see what’s beyond the bend in the road, so that you feel your feet begin to lighten and quicken their pace just to get there a little sooner? Where have you found the welcome and comfort that is ‘home?’

As I think of ‘home,’ I remember the feeling of driving alone for hours between my parents’ house and my apartment in Minneapolis. By the time I reached the Minnesota state line, my lower back had begun to ache; my chest felt heavy, and

my heart was beating an anxious patter that even Simon and Garfunkel couldn’t soothe. But within the next hour, I would come around a curve in I-94 and the city skyline would appear in front of me... and I would notice that I was smiling, that I was sitting up straighter, that my heart had calmed... I was almost home.

I still feel that way when I arrive in Minneapolis... and in the town where I grew up in Illinois. I feel that way now when I see the Chicago skyline, too... and when I get to the outskirts of Austin... and when I see First English as I turn off Guadalupe... and when I walk up to the doors of so many of your homes into which I have been welcomed so warmly. I used to think I needed to have one answer when people asked me, “Where’s home for you?” Now, I answer with a list. That’s the beauty of hospitality and of grace... I’m always on a journey... always somewhere new... and yet, I’m always finding home.

To conclude our Lenten reflection on hospitality and homes, the house worship groups and all members and friends of First English are invited to gather together for a **brief worship service and potluck dinner on Wednesday, May 11 from 6–7:30 P.M. in the Fellowship Hall** to reflect on our experiences during Lent and what we want to carry on from those experiences into the future. Last month, we focused intently on our Spring fundraiser. More than ever before, we really needed extra funds this year. The new fire code that was adopted last October dictated that we had 18 months to purchase and install a new, wired smoke detector system with pull stations located at every exit. We were a bit dismayed to find out that the costs would be well over \$20,000. To say the least, we needed a successful fundraiser!

Luckily, it is at times like these that a community can really pull together. We had two very generous benefactors who gave us matching donations equaling \$8500. A center's father donated many hours to taking action shots of our children on the playground which we later sold. A staff member's mother donated her time by guiding us on how to hold a successful raffle. A committee made up of the parent volunteers gathered some of the most amazing raffle prizes I have ever seen. Jennifer cooked us up some wonderful food to eat on our night of fellowship. And last, families, staff, church members and friends all bought raffle tickets from us.

After all was said and done, **we made about \$23,000 on our fundraiser—just enough to cover the costs of the smoke detector system.** More importantly, however, we built a little more on the foundation of our community.

Speaking of community members who have given us so much, we were all so saddened to hear the news that our long time friend of the child development center, Paul Jensen, had passed away last month. Paul gave countless volunteer hours to us, and we always appreciated his light hearted personality, especially when we had tough decisions to make. We will miss Paul and want his family to know we think of them often.

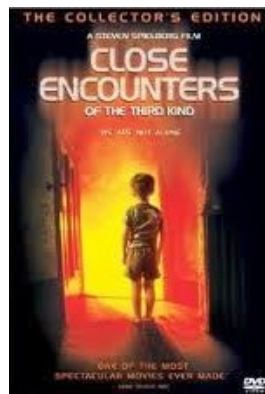
