At First English, we strive to use language for God, Christ, and humanity that is inclusive and diverse. Our use of feminine, non-gender, and masculine names and metaphors for God, both biblical and contemporary, helps us to experience God more fully. Languages that include persons of all gender identities, sexualities, ethnicities, and color, helps us better reflect God's expansive love and diversity.

Hearing assistance devices are available for use. Two options are available: an earpiece, or a hearing loop for those who use hearing aids. Please connect with an usher if you would like a hearing assistance device.

Children and adults are welcome here to be fully present and fully themselves. There is a *Faith of a Child* children's time before the sermon.

Baskets will not be passed during the liturgy.

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HAL CONGREGARSE

GATHERING + PALM SUNDAY, YEAR A

As we gather, you are invited to have an open heart and mind.

We continue praying for and supporting the people and leaders of Ukraine as conflict continues. We light a candle in the chancel (with the colors of the Ukrainian flag) each week.

PALM SUNDAY

"Hosanna" or "Hoshana" (הושענא) is a Hebrew word meaning save us now. Saint Augustine, fourth century bishop of the church, called Holy Week, the "Great Week" because of the great things that were accomplished during these days. Augustine said, "Unless the church can learn to identify itself with Christ in his death and resurrection, unless it can, on Palm Sunday, approach Jerusalem with Jesus, die with him on Holy Friday, and rise with him at the culmination of the Easter feast, the church cannot accomplish its mission, which is not only to proclaim the good news but to embody it in the world." Many in the church in recent history celebrate Palm Sunday in two parts – the entry into Jerusalem and then the Passion of Jesus. FELC chooses to observe the more ancient custom and celebrate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and reserve the Passion for Holy Friday. We celebrate the Lord of heaven and earth riding on a donkey – and we, too, join the procession of people – whoever we are and from wherever - Jesus welcomes all to follow him.

The assembly gathers on the terrace at the main entrance of the church building for the procession with palm branches.

Those not able to join in the procession may take their place inside.


All things come from you, O God, and we give back to you the gifts that come from you.



Ushers will direct you via the center aisle to a station to receive bread in your hand. Then you may proceed to a station and receive a small cup, where wine will be poured. Gluten-free wafers/grape juice are available. Please ask a minister.

Then make your way to your seat by a side aisle.

You are invited to kneel or sit in prayer, meditation, and singing.

If you are not communing, you are invited to a station where a minister will offer a prayer of blessing. If you desire communion or a blessing at your seat, please let an usher or minister know.

ECOPALMS

Today we use EcoPalms, which promote social justice, environmental stewardship, and are gathered through sustainable harvest programs. At least half of the farmers in Central Guatemala earn additional income from harvesting fronds and, more than a quarter of household heads support themselves exclusively by collecting fronds. Lutheran World Relief supports and promotes awareness of EcoPalms.

WELCOME CHILDREN


2023 CHICKEN BBQ: SATURDAY, APRIL 29, 4 TO 8 PM
