

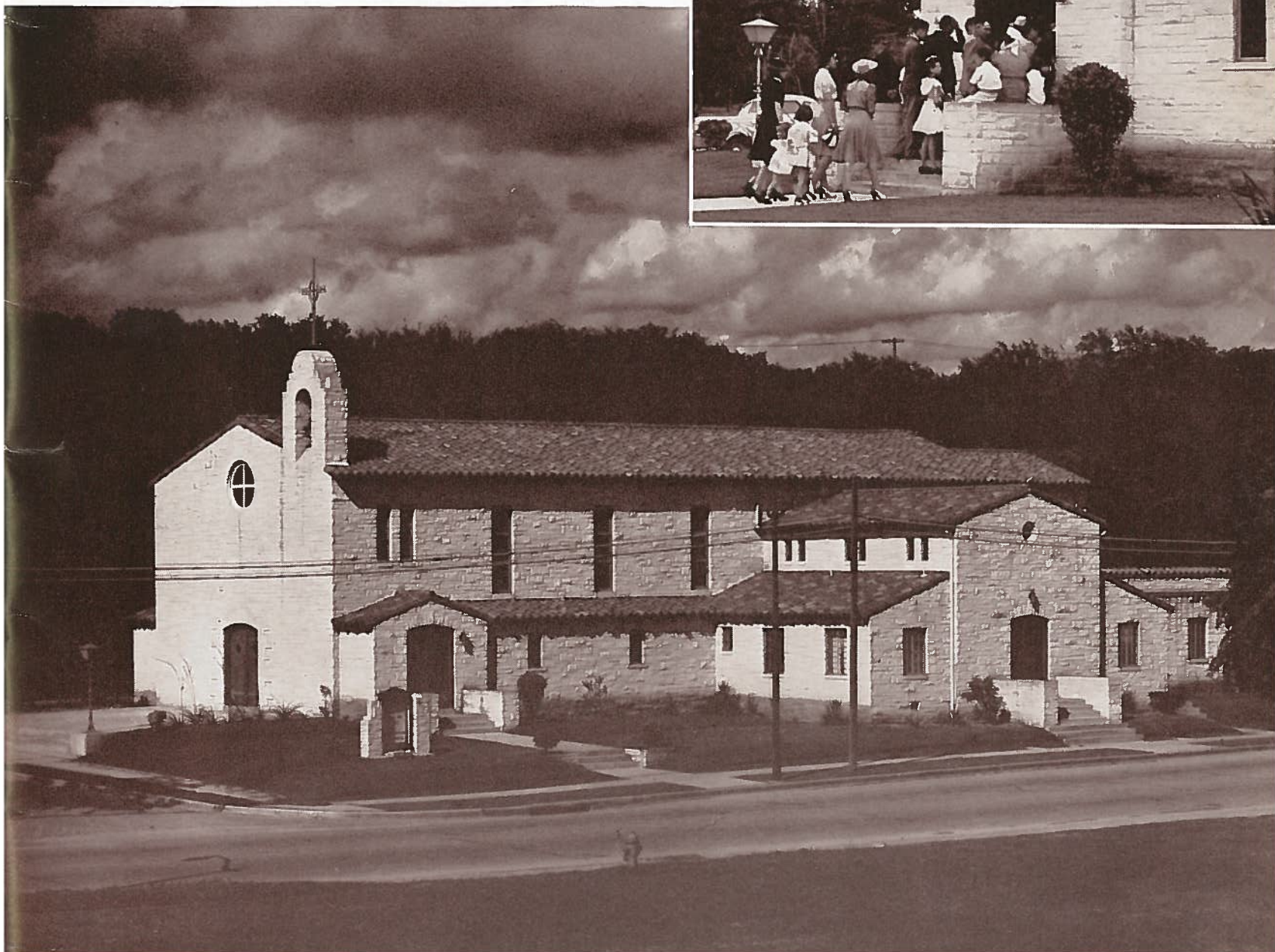

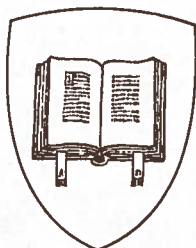

The history of the First English Evangelical Lutheran Church of Austin, Texas, is a modern chapter in "The Acts of the Apostles". Through the life and labors of our congregation the Holy Spirit continues to make effectual the redemptive work of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

The decision to establish a congregation of the United Lutheran Church in America in Austin was reached after a survey of the city had been made in June, 1936. The first meeting of Lutheran unchurched people was held at the University Y. M. C. A. on Wednesday evening, June 24, 1936. The Rev. Fred W. Kern, then President of the Texas Synod, U.L.C.A., presided. Twenty-six persons signed a request addressed to the synod for an English-speaking congregation.

This request was honored and the first public Service was conducted on Sunday evening, July 12, 1936, in the First Congregational Church. The following Sunday evening, July 19, after the Service in the same church, the congregation was formally organized.

The Board of American Missions granted aid

and requested the Rev. Fred W. Kern, pastor of Redeemer Lutheran Church, Houston, Texas, to accept the Call of the newly organized congregation. He accepted the Call and moved to Austin on September 8, 1936.

According to the constitution adopted on July 19, 1936, the congregation introduced a new principle of organization. Instead of the traditional mens', women's, and youth organizations the members of the congregation were divided in men's, women's, and youth divisions to which all members belong by virtue of their membership in the congregation.

Already in November, 1936, a building fund was opened. The rapid growth of the congregation made the need of a church home apparent. Three changes in place of worship were necessary to accommodate the growing membership. The last of these, the Seventh Day Adventist Church, had to be enlarged before the new building was ready.

The property at Whitis Avenue and Thirtieth Street was purchased on August 30, 1937. An architect was engaged and plans were under way for a church building. The Board of American Missions approved an Extension Loan on March 13, 1938. The beautiful house of God was dedicated on September 24, 1939.

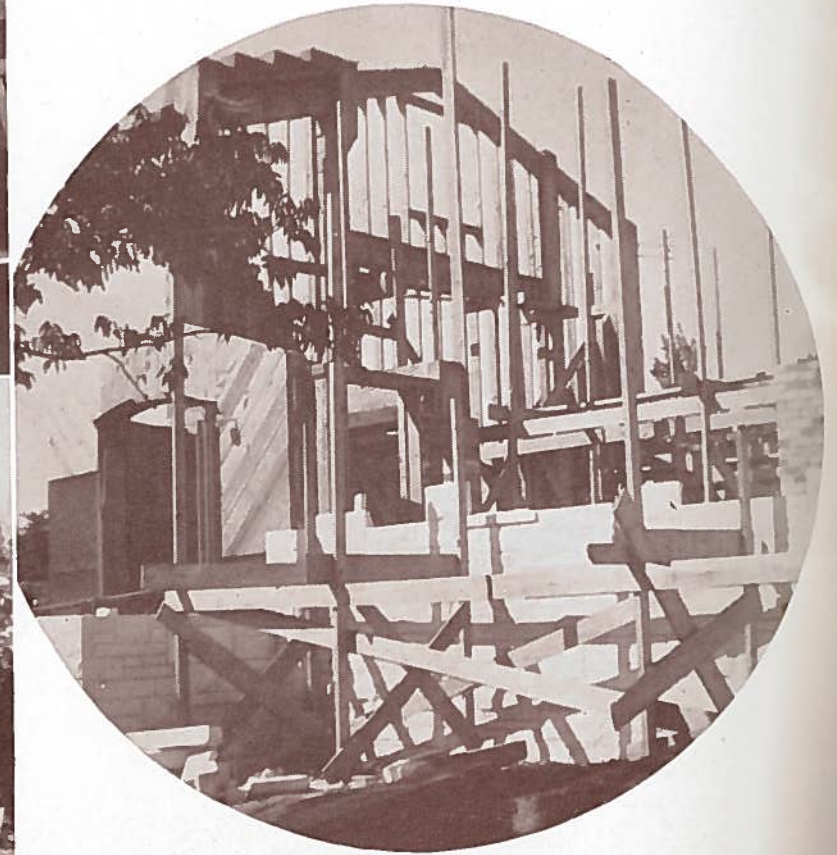

CORNER-STONE LAYING

Easter Sunday, April 9, 1939

The Means of Grace



God's grace, not the Church, saves souls; but God's grace comes to us through divinely given means. These means are the Word of God and the Sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion, and these have been committed to and are administered by the Church. The redemption which Christ

has accomplished for all men is applied to believing souls by the Holy Spirit through the means of Grace in the Church.

A true Christian life outside of the Church is impossible because it ignores God's plan for salvation. It is through the Word, as the chief Means of Grace, that the Holy Spirit "calls, enlightens, sanctifies, and preserves us in the true faith."

Through Holy Baptism God receives us into His covenant and opens up to us all the treasure of Christ's redemption. Here begins the cycle of the Christian life. Henceforth, unless we turn away from Christ and His Church, we may claim Saint Paul's promise: "Your life is hid with Christ in God."

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

"Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who hath begotten thee again of water and the Holy Ghost, and hath forgiven thee all thy sin, strengthen thee with His grace unto life everlasting. Amen."

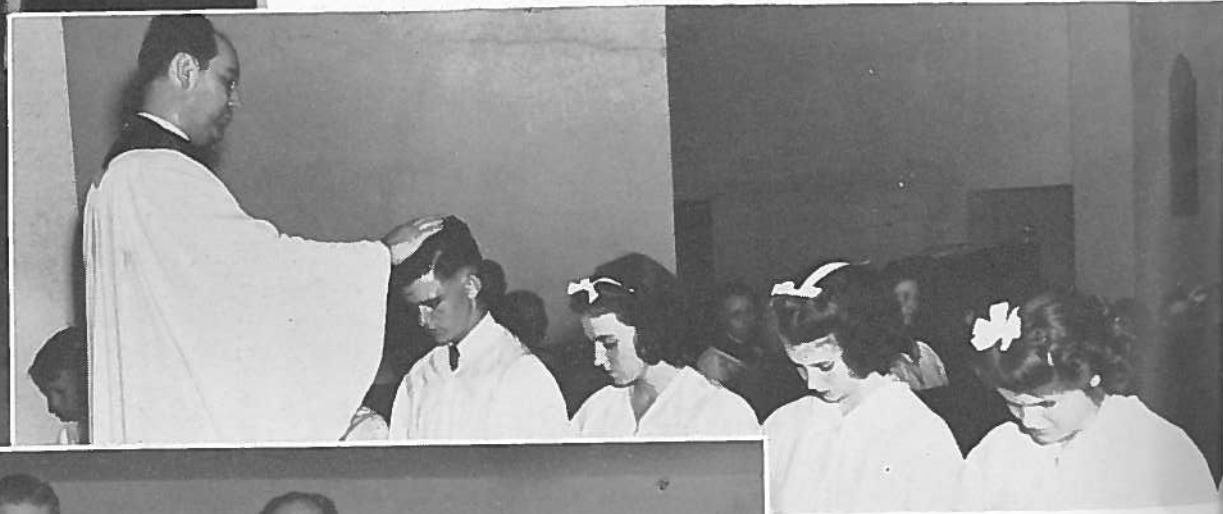
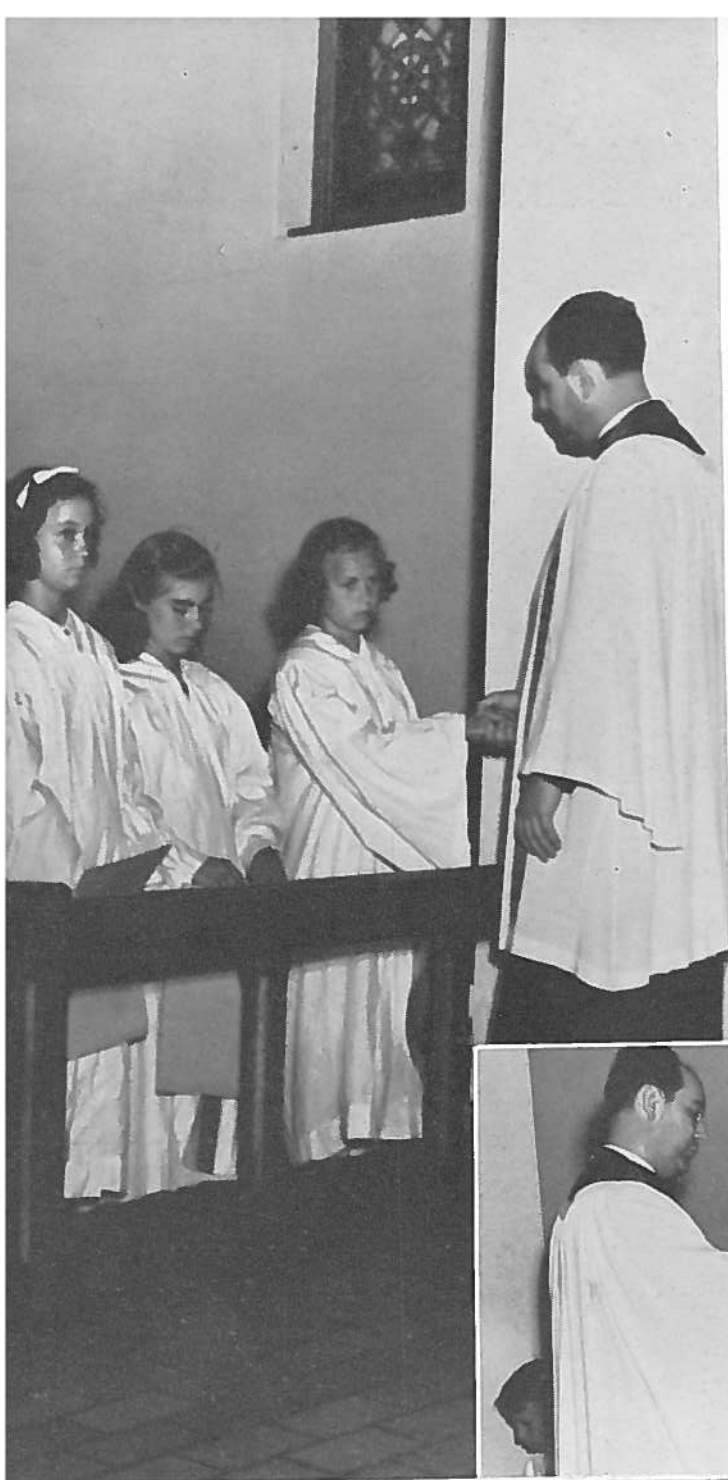


THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION

CONFIRMATION and infant baptism are closely connected. Christ has commanded His Church to teach them "to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you." Having been instructed in the Word of God and led to a knowledge of His will and of His gracious Gospel the catechumen makes a personal confession of faith in Christ and promises faithfulness to Him. Thereupon all the spiritual privileges of the Church are extended to the confessed Christian.

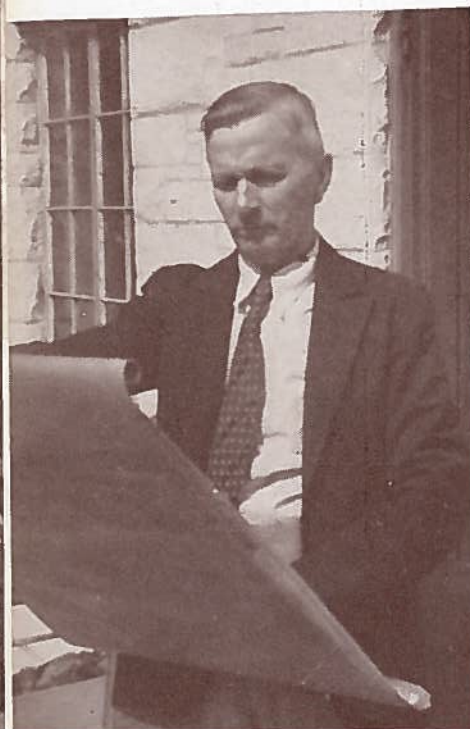

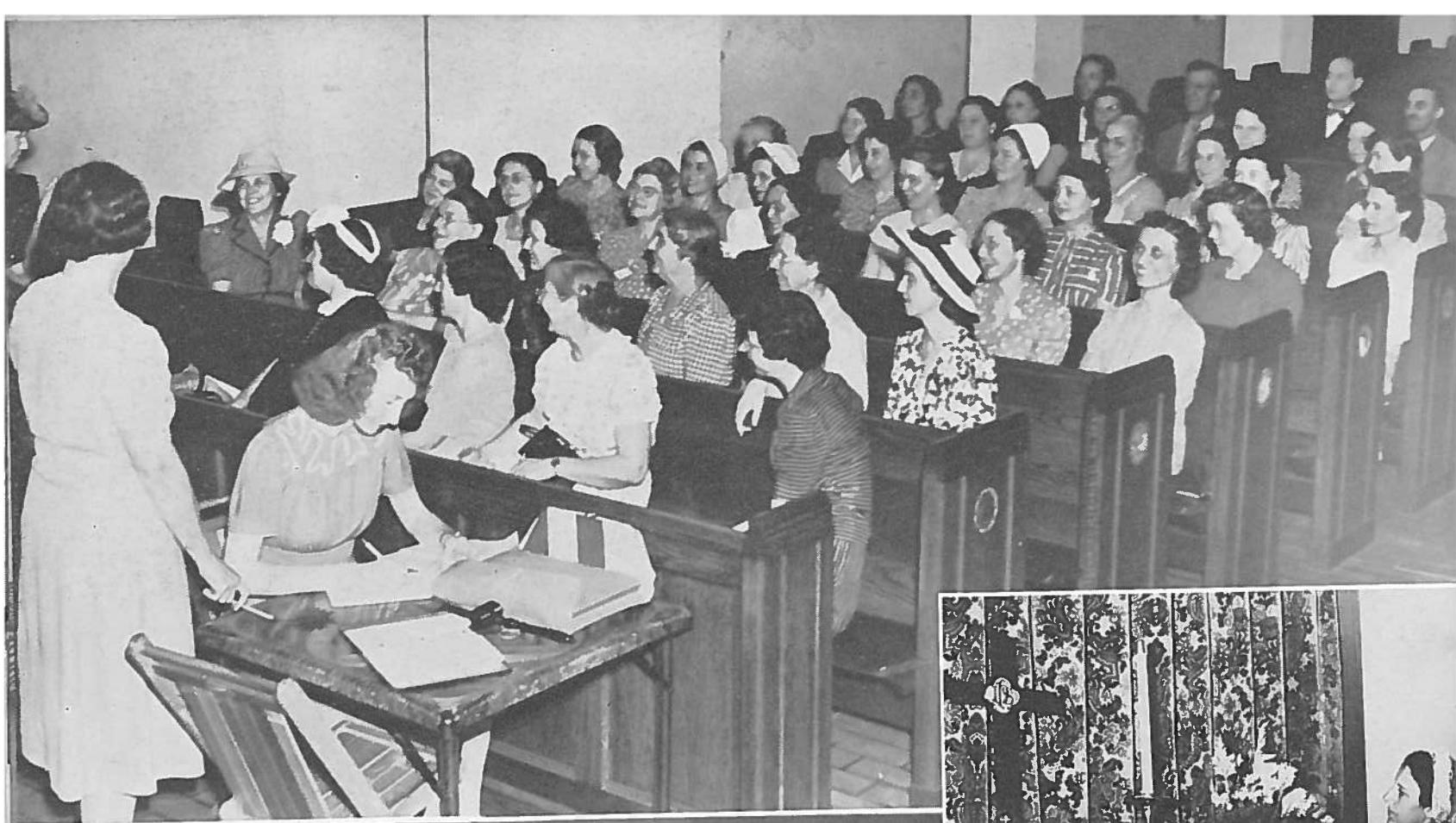

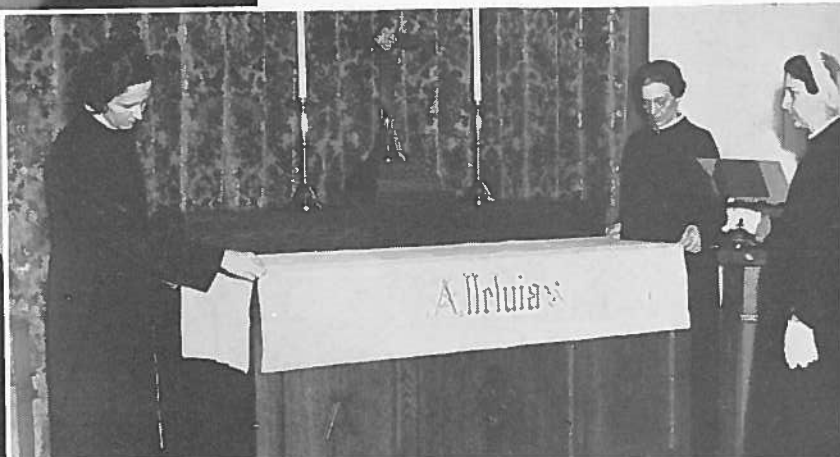

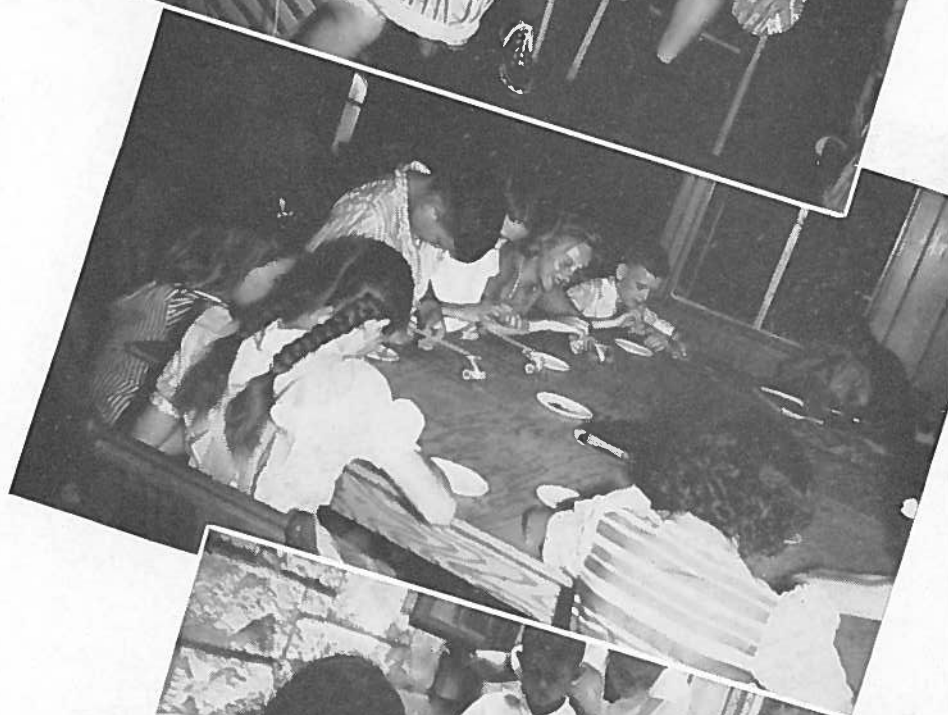




VACATION CHURCH SCHOOL
