Report of the Nominating Committee

Each year a Nominating Committee is appointed to nominate candidates for the Council. The Nominating Committee also brings forth the names of two voting members of the Congregation to attend the annual synod assembly. The Nominating Committee is Heidi Goebel (chair), Lee Baker, Marilynn Olson [outgoing council members] and Fran Collmann.

Prior to discussing nomination for the First English Lutheran Church Council with members of the congregation, we clarified two points with Allen Jensen, president of the congregation council.

We asked permission to allow the nominating committee to have four members this year.

We asked President Jensen to affirm an earlier statement that hereafter it will be possible to attend council meetings via Zoom.

Forced familiarity with improved computer technology during the pandemic has shown us that it is possible to conduct serious discussions, as well as routine business, via Zoom conferencing.

The ability to occasionally (or routinely) attend meetings remotely increases the number of persons who can consider serving the congregation in this way. Council terms are three years with one meeting per month. Many people travel or have reason to be away from Austin for work or family. Some people live far enough from the church that weather or traffic conditions may prevent their attending meetings. Unexpected Illness or responsibilities may make it impossible to leave home on a given night. We value in-person gatherings but can now see that including some members on Zoom while meeting in the parlor (when we can meet in the parlor) is a viable option.
